'A Fresh Breeze'

Thoughts on Pentecost by Pastor Alex von Wascinski

As I write down these thoughts I am sitting outside. I feel a fresh breeze. Of course, I don't see it, but I do feel it. And I can see how the wind is moving the trees around me, and the leaves on the windmill palm trembling in the breeze.



The Spirit of God is depicted as the blowing of the wind in the bible. Acts 2:2 (NRSV): "And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind. and it filled the entire house where they were sitting."

The image of the wind for God's acting through his Holy Spirit is remarkable. It describes how we as humans experience the effect of God's Spirit, the Holy spirit in our lives. You don't see the wind itself, but you see its effects. It is a power that moves us. And even as you can't see it you can hear the noise it causes—shaking the trees and flowers, moving objects around. The sound of the wind is the sound of the things it moves around or how it whistles around corners, blowing dust and trash away. If you meet the wind in the right way, catch it well, then you can also make good use of it—as humans have learned when they invented windmills. On the other hand, there is no way for you to really force the wind to do something. Compared to what the wind and the storm is capable of, our fans and even turbines are comparatively small artificial winds.

The other image used in Acts, is fire, divided tongues of fire. Acts 2:3–4 (NRSV): "3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." The fire, as the wind, has always been a marker for divine presence, the presence of God. Fire

warms people up. Fire is contagious. Fire draws people together. And as the wind, it has destructive power. With more and more bushfires, we exactly know what this means. On the other hand, for ages the Australian Aboriginal people have laid small fires to



cleanse out the bush of rampant brushwood in order to erase food for large and raging bushfires. We do not know what exactly is meant by the 'divided tongues of fire'. But interestingly, the logo of the UMC 'cross and flame' shows exactly this.

But we can well read what the effects of the Holy Spirit is. People suddenly hear the disciples speaking in their mother tongue. And, walls suddenly disappear. In Acts 2:1+2 (NRSV) the scene is set to "one place", which is "a house". But when the Spirit had come down, it seems like the walls disappear and all "the devout Jews" around in Jerusalem (Acts 2:5), people from all nations under heaven gathered. People from all nations can suddenly understand. They all can now hear the gospel of Jesus Christ, the son of God, who was born and lived among us, was crucified and died, resurrected and ascended into heaven.

It is Pentecost 2023. And Peace Church celebrates its birthday / anniversary right on that day. This year for the 39th time. And me, I have the honor of serving this wonderful church as its Lead Pastor now for almost exactly one year. I see so much of this Pentecost happening right at the DNA of Peace Church. Entering Peace Church, which is not a description of a certain church building, is like entering a community where you can feel the Holy Spirit around like a fresh breeze. For me, this perception comes with the people from so many nations and of all ages, of most various backgrounds and life stories around. And as you come in and enter the community, you can feel a real welcoming spirit around. And although Peace Church's central language is English, many languages are spoken at Peace


Church. And I hope that we foster and continue for example praying the Lord's Prayer in the language of our hearts—it might be your mother tongue or some other. Our Methodist heritage provides that we celebrate Holy Communion open to all people who desire to come to Christ's table—again, no matter if you are baptized or not, no matter what denomination you belong to (or none at all), no matter how worthy or unworthy you feel to come to the Lord's table, if you wish to come, come! And the spirit of preaching at Peace Church is never forcing people into believing or doing something but opening

doors, minds and hearts for the acting of the Holy Spirit. The spirit of our preaching and teaching is not forcing but inviting people to follow Christ on the path of love, peace and justice. And although we as congregation gather in 'one place' it is not the gathering space defining the community, but it is the community gathered which fills the space and defines the place as a place of Christ acting through us for peace of hearts. minds and the whole world. And as said in the UMC's brand promise, we do not define our fellowship by the walls in which we are gathered but by the doors we open(!). And as much as we enjoy to focus on God's word, the gathering around Christ's table and the acting of the Spirit in our community of believers and seekers, we also enjoy to open the doors, walk out gather in the open space or spread out to be examples and followers of Christ wherever we are or live.

So, as we celebrate Peace Church's birthday at Pentecost, we are reminded to follow this acting of the Holy Spirit among us—to feel it like a fresh breeze constantly moving us. We are reminded to open up our hearts to the needs of the people around us. We are reminded to open up our minds to live together in a spirit of love and mutual respect, whatever background we have. And, we are reminded to always open up our doors that we will always move out to the people in this world and to be always welcoming to everyone who comes in—as Christ always welcomed everyone to his table with arms wide open.



Did You Know That...

...the Social Media team is actively promoting content about Peace Church online? ...there was a joint Ascension Day service and BBQ with the Philippus congregation? The bilingual service was followed by a barbecue.

...the Sunday school has grown? There were less than ten children at the beginning of the year and now we're sometimes over twenty, so big that we've outgrown our room! It's great to have so many children and we've started splitting up the classes again.

...there will be a special worship service led by the Sunday School on 18 June? The service is based on the EMK's 'Kids help kids' initiative, focussing this year on the situation of children in Soweto, South Africa, under the theme 'You are not

alone'. The offering during this service will support a project helping child-headed households in Soweto. After the service we will have a cake buffet!

Change Process in the UMC

In November 2022, the UMC South Germany Annual Conference (Evangelisch-methodistische Kirche, Süddeutsche Jährliche Konferenz, EMK-SJK) launched a 'change process' in order for the United Methodist Church in Southern Germany to be fit for the future.

The current challenges

In Germany, fewer people are engaging with church. And yet, in the face of many challenges and crises, many people are searching for meaning, support and direction.

The vision

The EMK-SJK sees a realistic future with:

- churches that focus on relationship and becoming a spiritual home for many people.
- appealing, up-to-date services that address the current issues of our time and penetrate spiritually.
 People can recharge their batteries and go changed and enriched into their everyday lives.
- congregations that are well supported and accompanied in their challenges.
- changed structures that form viable units for the future.
- multi-professional full-time teams that are giveoriented.
- stable finances that do not rely exclusively on donations.
- motivated volunteers who enjoy working with us.
- professional, appealing public relations that represent what we can offer.

The way forward

The practical implications to make such a vision a reality are currently being worked out.



Bishop Harald Rückert writes: "Our main purpose remains the same: To bear witness to the message of the Gospel with deeds and words. Our structures should serve this purpose."

This might look like new forms and expressions of church. It might involve streamlining administrative functions in order for pastors to dedicate more time and energy to the people around them.

Bishop Harald adds, "We need renewed thinking: forward-looking, risk-taking, fault-tolerant, trusting and flexible."

What does this mean for Peace Church?

Peace Church UM is currently one Charge within the UMC South Germany Annual Conference (SJK). The new plan is by 2025 to make one large Charge out of several churches.

Church leaders and lay people in Munich, Augsburg and Rosenheim are starting to meet to discuss what this could look like. Peace Church UM is taking part in these discussions. We will keep you informed of the progress, ideas and any decisions which are taken.
