⁴ Praise him, you highest heavens and you waters above the skies.

⁵ Let them praise the name of the Lord, for at his command they were created,

⁶ and he established them for ever and ever he issued a decree that will never pass away.

12 times "Praise" in this Psalm
12 months,
12 tribes of Israel
12 apostles

12... wholeness

3 times "name"
4 times "Lord"
3 times 4 for 12
"The name of the Lord"

The Lord created space in the middle of chaos waters.

The Lord protects creation from chaos.

All of nature and even chaos praises the Lord.

PRAISE THE LORD FROM THE EARTH...

⁷ Praise the Lord from the earth, you great sea creatures and all ocean depths, ⁸ lightning and hail, snow and clouds, stormy winds that do his bidding, ⁹ you mountains and all hills, fruit trees and all cedars, ¹⁰ wild animals and all cattle, small creatures and flying birds,

Praise the Lord!

All we see, all we hear,
every bit of nature, every living thing,
all of creation we hear, see, feel,
praises the Lord!

Everything is in order.

Everything praises the Lord.

For everything is created by the Most High.

::: THREE :::

PRAISE THE LORD WOMEN AND MEN...

11 kings of the earth and all nations, you princes and all rulers on earth, 12 young men and women, old men and children. 13 Let them praise the name of the Lord, for his name alone is exalted; his splendor is above the earth and the heavens.

Psalm 148:11-13
